University of Texas Medical Branch Family Medicine Interest Group wins Texas and national FMIG Program of Excellence Awards

AUSTIN, TEXAS — The University of Texas Medical Branch’s Family Medicine Interest Group was awarded the first-place prize in the Texas Academy of Family Physicians Texas FMIG Program of Excellence Awards, as well as the overall award in the 2022 American Academy of Family Physicians Program of Excellence Awards.

FMIGs are student-run organizations with faculty and departmental support. They provide a forum in medical schools for students interested in family medicine. FMIG programs across Texas applied for the award and TAFP’s Council on Workforce and Member Engagement reviewed the applications and selected the winning programs. Award recipients receive cash prizes to help cover student travel costs to attend AAFP’s National Conference of Family Medicine Residents and Students. Representatives for the FMIG attended National Conference July 28 – 30 in Kansas City, Missouri, where they were also awarded the national Academy’s overall award.

The University of Texas Medical Branch’s FMIG hosts a family medicine procedural workshop event annually called Primary Care Procedures at the Primary Care Pavilion. The FMIG also hosts a family medicine residency fair, typically inviting over 15 residency programs from four states to attend. Additionally, they help their community by providing flu vaccines.

Outstanding medical students leading and participating in their campus’ FMIG activities strengthen our primary care workforce and help to ensure a bright future for family medicine. TAFP congratulates University of Texas Medical Branch’s FMIG on their achievements.
