Dr. Siy shared the names of the new scholars selected – Dr. Corynne McEachern and Dr. Ryan Craig. The interview committee this year included Dr. Linda Siy, Dr. Jake Margo, Dr. Lloyd Van Winkle, and Kathy McCarthy. Dr. Siy thanked the members who reviewed applications in the first round of the process. Those volunteers included Drs. Jessica Glick, Puja Sehgal, Mary Nguyen, Donald Nino, Richard Young, Lesca Hadley, and Paul Swegler.

The resident scholars selected in 2024 - Dr. Melanie Diaz and Dr. Kristie Tu presented on their projects. Dr. Diaz is focusing on addressing teen pregnancy in the Waco area and Dr. Tu is working on staying connected with economically disadvantaged patients by providing cell phone access.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENT SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Dr. Lloyd Van Winkle provided an overview of the TAFP Foundation finances. Six months into the fiscal year, we're on track to meet our expense budget.

Dr. Stephen Benold presented a report on the TAFP Foundation investments. The annual rate of return for the calendar year 2024 was 8.5%. He noted that 2/3 of the assets are in US Treasury bills. There were no changes made to the asset allocation, but he will rebalance the portfolio.

TRAVEL FUNDING

Kathy McCarthy provided a brief update on travel funding. The new structure is in place providing travel funding for resident and student leaders for Annual Session and Interim Session with most of the funding allocated for the TAFP Student and Resident Summit in August and AAFP's FUTURE (previously National Conference). The funding for in state meetings is now determined by geography with those living further from the meeting having access to more funding. Any leader funding not used will be reallocated for additional spots for the summit. The TAFP Foundation budget includes \$100,000 in travel funding.

RESEARCH

Dr. Richard Young provided an update on research funded by the TAFP Foundation. There were eight new proposals for this cycle. The committee decided to fund three. Dr. Young made an appeal for an additional reviewer to help him and Dr. Bruce Echols with research grant reviews and Dr. Lesca Hadley volunteered to help with the next cycle. The agenda packet included final reports from three researchers.

In place of Dr. Larry Kravitz, Tim Heinz presented on the new Texas Family Medicine Research Journal that is being organized to provide additional opportunities for publication for Texas family medicine research. The TAFP Foundation will help with collecting donations until the journal is established and approved for 501c3 status with the IRS.

PHILANTHROPIST OF THE YEAR

In 2024, the decision was made to create a nomination process and not necessarily give the award every year to make it more meaningful. A draft nomination form was provided in the packet to allow nominations for this award. No changes were made and the consensus was to continue with the

Dr. Donald Nino provided an update on the development of the fund. 20 The chapter has a CD that will be maturing soon, and they will use that for a matching campaign to 21 fund the scholarship. 22 23 **CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY** 24 25 The TAFP Foundation does not have a conflict of interest policy and that is a question on the IRS 990 26 form each year. Paul and Dr. Erica Swegler were recognized for their many years of service on the Board of Trustees. They plan to relocate outside of Texas for a year and will resign from the Board.



Re: Update on Resident Scholars program

The program has been in place since 2020 and is doing great. Our two most recent scholars are planning to join us in Addison to discuss their projects.


Here is a reminder of what the program provides:

- \$2,500 stipend during first year of residency
- Travel support to attend TAFP's Annual Session and Primary Care Summit and C. Frank Webber Lectureship and Interim Session during their second year of residency.
- \$2,500 stipend at the end of their second year of residency.
- Travel support to attend AAFP's Congress of Delegates and National Conference of Constituency Leaders in their third year of residency.
- \$5,000 stipend at the end of their third year of residency.

Here is a recap on our scholars:

- 2020 Kendra Williams, MD completed residency in 2022, practicing in Knox City, TX. Represented Texas at NCCL in 2025.
- 2021 Tyler King, DO completed residency in 2023. Practicing in Laredo and serving on the Laredo City Council
- 2022 Carmella DeSerto, MD completed residency in 2024. Practicing in San Antonio with UT Health. Represented Texas at NCCL in 2025.
 - Gerardo Rodriguez, MD completed residency in 2024. Working at Health Services of North Texas in Denton.
- 2023 Madeline Huff, MD completed residency in 2025. Is working for WellMed in Austin. Dorcas Omari, MD – completed residency in 2025. Working at First Primary Care in The Woodlands

- 2024 Kristie Tu, MD Third year resident in Sugar Land. Enrolled in TAFP's Resident Leadership Experience.

Re: TAFP Foundation Travel Funding for Residents and Students

This was our second year under the funding structure, and it continues to work reasonably well. This year, we established a deadline to register for the conference after they receive funding approval. If the student or resident did not register, their funding was reallocated to another student or resident. We provided more than \$50,000 in funding for students and residents to attend the Summit in August and provided scholarship checks to 46 medical students to attend AAFP's FUTURE (formerly National Conference) plus we continue to fund the resident and student delegate and alternate delegate with reimbursement at a higher rate.

With our experience, we suggest creating a little more structure for allowable expenses for instate meetings. We have limits based on geographic distance, but no other guidelines in place. We would like to create a travel funding FAQ to share with recipients and put guidelines in place on rental cars, limit mileage reimbursement, and hotel nights specifically for travel to the Student and Resident Summit. The FAQ will include general information about the purpose of travel reimbursement being to reduce the barriers to participation in conferences, encouragement to pool resources by carpooling and room sharing with fellow students and residents, and a reminder that this funding is made possible by the generous donations of family physicians.

Mileage reimbursement

The TAFP Foundation reimburses mileage at the maximum IRS approved rate – currently .70 per mile. We had mileage claims up to \$880 for the Summit this year. For some attendees, it would be more cost-effective to fly, and we don't verify that they are driving their personal vehicle. **We recommend limiting mileage reimbursement to \$300.** I don't think there is anywhere in Texas where you need more than that to pay for gas to and from.

Rental car reimbursement

We have not had clear policy on rental cars. In some cases, it can be more cost effective than driving a personal vehicle and claiming mileage reimbursement, so we want to allow it, but with limitations. We recommend limiting the rental car reimbursement to three days, economy, compact, or mid-sized vehicles, and only for those not being reimbursed for


airfare. Further we will state in the FAQ that if renting a vehicle, they can request gas reimbursement but not mileage.

Hotel reimbursement

While most attendees asked for reimbursement for one or two nights, we did have a few that seemed to add on residency visits, rotations, or vacation and included additional nights. We recommend establishing a maximum of two nights at the hotel unless pre-approved by staff.

Below you can see our totals for FY24 and FY25. Oddly, we reimbursed exactly the same number of students and residents over the course of the year!

Re: Financial update

We are waiting for the FY25 audit to be completed. Once we have a draft, it will be sent to all trustees for review. I was able to get the worksheet for endowments to update the investment income reflected in the scholarship report in 5.B. Scholarships and to use for budgeting.

Just a reminder that all contributions designated for endowments are permanently restricted. We don't include them in the budget. By our policy, we can spend up to 4% of scholarships and other endowments each year. The endowments for research, student interest, resident leadership and TAFP fund endowments are included in the general income to help fund our grants, travel funding, and FMIG activities.

A few notes:

- TAFP continues to provide an \$80,000 grant each year to the TAFP Foundation. In addition, TAFP provides in-kind support through the TAFP staff time spent on Foundation operations.
- The fundraising dinner last year and this year were set to benefit medical student travel. The event sponsorships were all coded to that part of the budget with ticket sales reflected as "event income".
- While we didn't turn anyone down for travel funding for the TAFP Summit, not all funding was utilized.
- With projected individual donations, continued TAFP support, and the endowment income, I was able to create a balanced budget.




We have several opportunities for fundraising and visibility for the work of the Foundation at the 2025 Annual Session and Primary Care Summit.

Re: Research Update

Research is still going strong, but we only had fewer proposals for the fall cycle than we've had the last few. Drs. Lesca Hadley and Richard Young reviewed the proposals and decided to fund all three. Assuming the draft budget is approved, that will leave enough funding for four proposals in the spring.


